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CC to handle communications for Arlington County, VA's BRAC Initiative.

Assignment to include all materials for BRAC Transition Center

WASHINGTON, DC, June 26, 2008—Arlington County's Base Realignment and Closure Commission (BRAC) has brought in Channel Communications (CC) to develop marketing communications materials. CC has an on-going contract with Arlington County's Office of Economic Development.

Initially, CC's work will focus on the BRAC Transition Center, involving a workforce services brochure and business services brochure.
